**Wien Hbf (Vienna Central Station) /
Wien St. Marx ⇌ Wien Praterstern
7 September 2026 – end October 2027**

- No trains are running between Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) / Wien St. Marx and Wien Praterstern
- Check alternative connections of Wiener Linien
- Lines REX1 and REX7 have been diverted
- New schedules taking effect in the eastern region

Vienna remains mobile: alternative services during the core line closure

**Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) /
Wien St. Marx – Wien Praterstern
7 September 2026 – end October 2027**

The S-Bahn Wien **Upgrade** is making the rail network fit for the future: modernised, digitised and more efficient. To make travelling with the S-Bahn Wien even faster and more reliable in the future, extensive **modernisation work and track closures** on the core line will be necessary.

The following measures are being taken to ensure you can continue to reach your destination quickly and reliably:

-  **U1 U2 U4** Increased frequency
-  **U6** Frequent service and a reserve train during morning service
-  **0** Tram Line 0: Only long trains in service to increase capacity and measures to speed up public transport services
-  **18** Tram Line 18: Extended to U2 Stadion
-  **62** Tram Line 62: Diversion on the section Kliebergasse – Hauptbahnhof (Central Station) – Quartier Belvedere. No service on the section Kliebergasse – Karlsplatz
-  Direct shuttle bus SH6 between Wien Meidling (Eichenstraße exit) and Längenfeldgasse (U4, U6) to relieve congestion on the U6 and provide an additional connection to the U4
-  CAT by bus: Wien Mitte – Vienna Airport (separate fare)
-  Additional connections with Vienna Airport Bus:
 - VAB 4:** Karlsplatz – Vienna Airport (separate fare)
 - VAB 5:** Wien Praterstern – Vienna Airport (separate fare)
-  Train replacement service S80 with all stops

We ask that you use alternative connections within the existing Vienna public transport network.

- Suspension of the line S80** between Wien Hütteldorf and Wien Meidling
- Diversion REX7:** Vienna Airport – Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station), continuing toward Mödling as S2
- Diversion REX1:** Wien Stadlau – Wien Simmering – Wien Hbf (Vienna Central Station)

Construction work to improve the rail link: line S80 suspended
From 7 September, 2026 until the end of 2027, the line S80 will be suspended between Wien Hütteldorf and Wien Meidling.

Replacement service: Train replacement service (SEV) with buses running every 15 minutes between Wien Hütteldorf and Wien Meidling, stopping at Wien Hietzinger Hauptstraße and Wien Speising.

Ticket Acceptance

To ensure you can continue to travel even during the main closure between Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station)/Wien St. Marx and Wien Praterstern, valid ÖBB tickets will be accepted on the following fast routes (in both directions) along this section:

- **The direct route:** U1 Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) – Praterstern
- **The alternative:** tram line O with stops at all stations on the S-Bahn Wien core line
- **The bypass:** tram line 18 Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) – Stadion (stadium), then continue on the U2 to Praterstern

Tickets are valid exclusively on these alternative routes. For other connections, the Wiener Linien Terms of Carriage and the fare regulations of the Verkehrsverbund Ost-Region (VOR) apply.

VOR tickets that are not valid in Vienna's core zone and ÖBB group tickets are excluded from this ticket acceptance policy.

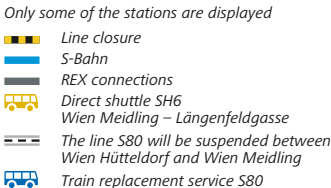

From southern Lower Austria: Most trains from the south terminate at or depart from Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station); a few additional trains terminate at or depart from Wien Meidling.

From northern Lower Austria: Most trains from the north terminate at or depart from Wien Praterstern; a few additional trains terminate at or depart from Wien Floridsdorf.

- **REX1:** Detour via Wien Stadlau – Wien Simmering – Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and continuing toward Wiener Neustadt
- **REX7:** Detour from Kaiserebersdorf to Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and continuing toward Mödling as S2
- **Line S80:** Runs from Wien Aspern Nord to Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and continues as S3 via Wien Meidling to Wiener Neustadt

- **REX1:** Detour via Wien Stadlau – Wien Simmering – Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and continuing toward Wiener Neustadt
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Connecting to Vienna Airport

- **The S7** runs to/from Wien St. Marx → connecting to tram lines 18 and 71
- **REX 7:** Diverted from Kaiserebersdorf to Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and continues as S2 to Mödling
- **Long-distance trains (RJX, RJ and IC)** continue to run between Wien Hauptbahnhof (Vienna Central Station) and Vienna Airport
- **City Airport Train (CAT):** Rail replacement service by bus (CAT by bus) between Wien Mitte (Marxergasse 1b) and Vienna Airport (Terminal 3) with up to five connections per hour in each direction.

- **Vienna Airport Bus:** The existing VAB routes from Wien Westbahnhof, Schwedenplatz and Donauzentrum remain in service. New additions:
 - Line VAB 4 Karlsplatz – Vienna Airport
